Minutes

Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was opened by **Clir David Robey**, Vice Chair of Kidlington Parish Council, who welcomed all attendees. **Clir Lesley McLean**, Chair of the Parish Council, also gave introductory remarks and thanked the community for their participation.

Parish Council Financial Report

Cllr David Thurling, Vice Chair of the Finance and Assets Committee, presented an overview of the Parish Council's financial position for the year.

Key points included:

- The council remained within its budget for the financial year.
- Future considerations include potential adjustments due to inflation and increased maintenance demands.

Parish Council Community and Environment Report

Clir Alison Street, Chair of the Community Committee, reported on recent initiatives and community engagement activities.

Highlights included:

- Ongoing collaboration with local groups to promote biodiversity.

Presentation from Rhiannon Young, Wild Kidlington

Questions from Kidlington Residents

The floor was opened for questions from residents.

Key issues raised included:

• Oxford United Football Club (OUFC) Plans:

Residents expressed concerns and sought clarification regarding potential developments involving OUFC, particularly around location, community impact, and infrastructure demands.

• Land at the Back of The Moors:

Questions were raised about the future use and possible development of land behind The Moors. Several residents emphasised the importance of preserving green space and maintaining transparency in all planning processes.

The Parish Council acknowledged these concerns and assured residents that all matters would be considered carefully, with ongoing public engagement and timely updates as more information becomes available.
